

The top layer, always visible:

The administrator of the personal data is **Hi Poly! Studio** with its registered office in Cracow, Szlachtowskiego 28. The processing of personal data will be based on the legitimate interest of the administrator, which is to respond to the contact initiated by filling in and sending the contact form. You have the right to access your data, obtain a copy of it, correct it, delete it, limit processing, transfer it, lodge an objection, lodge a complaint to the supervisory authority. *More*

The right layer, when expanded:

The administrator of the personal data is **Hi Poly! Studio** with its registered office in Krakow at Szlachtowskiego 28.

The processing of personal data will take place on the basis of the administrator's legitimate interest, which is to respond to the contact initiated by filling in and sending the contact form, in accordance with Article 6(1)(f) of Regulation (EU) 2016/679 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 27 April 2016 on the protection of natural persons with regard to the processing of personal data and on the free movement of such data, and repealing Directive 95/46/EC (General Data Protection Regulation)(hereinafter: GDPR).

Personal data may be made available to entities authorised to do so by law. The Administrator may, by means of a written agreement, entrust another entity with the processing of personal data to the extent and for the purpose necessary for the performance of the service, including entities providing hosting services. Personal data will not be transferred to a third country/international organisation.

Personal data will be stored for the period necessary for the provision of the service, not later than 12 months from the date of sending the response to the request.

You have the right to access the content of your data, to obtain a copy of it, to rectification, erasure, restriction of processing, portability, to object.

You have the right to lodge a complaint to the supervisory authority - the President of the Office for Personal Data Protection, if you consider that the processing of your personal data violates the provisions of GDPR.

Providing personal data is voluntary, but necessary for the purposes indicated.
